Old Business: Implementable and Collaborative Actions

Implementable Project IG in progress

We are currently working though our implementation process guide for two existing prescribed burn units within the Three Sisters Implementation Area on the Blue Ridge Ranger District. These burn units are being planned for spring 2024 entry. A notification including an Implementation Plan for these burn units will be provided as they are finalized.

Project Updates

- Mooneyham timber sale layout continues in anticipation of FY24 timber sale
- Planning continues with The Nature Conservancy for the Holly Creek Road paving project. An engineering design package is currently in progress.
- Earl's Ford Updates
 - The Wild and Scenic River Section 7 determination report is complete and in review for final determination.
 - The Forest Service completed a cultural resource survey of portions of the Lower Warwoman watershed in 2022 and compiled the findings in a report. The Georgia State Historic Preservation Office and affected Tribes were consulted on the report, and it was determined additional test excavations are necessary to fully assess the National Register eligibility of the cultural resources present. Data gathered from the test excavations will also broaden our understanding of the cultural history of this area of northeastern Georgia and mitigate against any potentially adverse effects resulting from the proposed undertaking.
 - The Heritage Program is planning a Passport in Time project for the spring of 2024 to aid in this test excavation. Passport In Time (PIT) is a volunteer program that offers opportunities for the public to assist Forest Service Heritage professionals with archaeological and historical research and management on National Forest System lands. The Heritage Program Manager has already identified a select group of public volunteers for this project.

Future IA projects

- Upper Conasauga
 - District interdisciplinary team held a kick-off meeting in November.
 - District has completed vegetation field work for the IA.
- Lower Chattooga
 - District interdisciplinary team kick-off meeting being planned for first quarter of 2023 Calander year.
 - Completed inventory of approximately 4,750 acres of the implementation area.
 - Designed a timber cruise to complete common stand exams in a further 2,700 acres.
 - The district has plans to bring on additional compacity utilizing detailed positions. This will allow for increased efforts within the Foothills Landscape. These positions will begin at the end of January.
